

The Black Resilience in Colorado (BRIC) fund founded on June 19, 2020 (Juneteenth), is the first Black-focused community fund established in Colorado, providing financial resources and support to Black-led and Black-serving organizations. Its mission is to be a perpetual resource that supports the growth and sustainability of Black communities, champions Blacks to invest in themselves and their communities, be a leading voice for change, and own their power of resilience. The focus on growth, sustainability, and empowerment aligns with the broader goals to achieve racial equity and justice. BRIC aims to break down barriers, amplify Black voices, and foster self-investment within Black communities through its programs and initiatives. This approach recognizes the importance of community-led solutions and empowers those directly impacted by systemic injustices.


LIBERATION INVESTMENT GRANT
